What do Ted Lasso and The Curious Savage Have in Common? Two things: A dart board and a beautiful, life giving sense of curiosity

I don't know if you have seen the TV series Ted Lasso (on Apple TV) but one of my favorite scenes in the show involves Ted (who reminds me a lot of Mrs. Savage) throwing darts for some pretty large stakes against a pompous windbag Rupert (perhaps a Titus Savage type character?).


Ted Lasso: Mae... what do I need to win? Mae: Two triple 20's and a bullseye. Rupert Mannion: [chuckles] Good luck.

[pause]

Ted Lasso: You know, Rupert, guys have underestimated me my entire life. And for years, I never understood why. It used to really bother me. But then one day, I was driving my little boy to school and I saw this quote by Walt Whitman, and it was painted on the wall there. It said, "Be curious, not judgmental." I like that. [throws a dart and hits his first triple 20] So I get back in my car and I'm driving to work, and all of a sudden it hits me. All them fellas that used to belittle me, not a single one of them were curious. You know, they thought they had everything all figured out. So they judged everything, and they judged everyone. And I realized that their underestimating me... who I was... had nothing to do with it. 'Cause if they were curious, they would've asked questions. You know? Like, "Have you played a lot of darts, Ted?"

[throws another dart and hits his second triple 20] To which I would've answered, "Yes, sir. Every Sunday afternoon at a sports bar with my father, from age 10 until I was 16 when he passed away." [pause] Barbecue sauce.

[throws his third dart and hits the bullseye; crowd cheers wildly]
Good game, Rupert.



Ted Lasso has mastered the art of curiosity, and so has Mrs. Savage. It's something I'm actively working on in my own life. I constantly remind myself that every one of us is in the murky middle of our stories. The purpose of a story is for the characters to change. Given space and grace people can change their minds, plans, dart games, and sometimes things change in the blink of an eye or in one dark moment when the lights go out. When we judge and put someone in a box based on what we see or hear, or even just one moment of their story (or one social media post), we aren't being curious.

Judging is taking a person or situation and thinking that we have enough evidence to make a final decision. We'll never have all the information on a person or situation. The best thing we can do is keep asking questions, genuinely listen to someone else's story, and attempt to understand them with curiosity and gracious assumptions. Fear is usually what leads me to make quick judgments. Fear can warp our lives and hold us back, attempting to keep us "safe." Being curious requires courage, and it takes a brave kind of "savage"ness to ask hard questions or to continue moving forward in a story when you're unsure of the outcome. Fears can prevent us from living out our most beautiful stories, or from hearing other people's stories, particularly when they differ from our own. Fear causes us to judge quickly and listen and learn slowly. Can we all strive to be savagely curious?

None of us knows our entire story, or anyone else's, because it isn't finished. We're all in the middle, and it often feels like Mrs. Paddy turns out the lights on us. In our final scene on stage, my goal was to convey there's always more to every story. There can be wholeness, healing, growth, and beauty that lasts forever beyond our finite walls. I need to know that beyond Jeff's shame, Florence's sadness, Fairy's fears of being overlooked, Hannibal's failure, Mrs. Paddy's anger, the Savage's greed, and Mrs. Savage's loneliness, there is a garden of loveliness for each of them, blooming with life. I see myself in each of these characters, and I crave the curiosity to see the view beyond the limiting walls. I hope this show makes you bloom with curiosity as well.

Remember to stay curious.
